The Illinois Workers' Compensation Commission recently rejected a proposal by the Medical Fee Advisory Board that would have increased costs of most physician interactions by 30 percent for

all workers' compensation claims in Illinois. The argument made in favor of the proposed rate hike was that the low reimbursement rates for doctors that treat workers' compensation patients limit their access to care. However, Illinois ranks 6-8th (depending on what metrics are used) in overall costs.

The Commission voted 5-4 against the proposal.





Top 5 Workers' Compensation Resolutions For 2018

1/ Examine Your Accident Investigation Policy

A good defense starts at the ground level. By the time your defense counsel receives a questionable claim, it is often months or even years after the accident. By then, it can be too late to mount a successful defense. Resolve to work with your team members on the ground level to ensure that you interview key witnesses, document important facts and preserve evidence from the start.

2/ Make A Decision Quickly

If your employee has a legitimate claim, accept it, pay benefits and get them back to good health and work as quickly as possible. However, if they don't have a compensable claim, it is equally important to make that decision quickly and inform the employee of your denial. Waiting an inordinate amount of time or doing an indefinite "investigation" doesn't help you or the claim.

3/ Investigate Subrogation Early

Third party liability continues to be commonly overlooked, even though it is an excellent chance to recover money. Consider whether there is subrogation as early in the claim as possible, and proceed aggressively if there is as possibility of recovery.

4/ Use Your Resources

IMEs, UR, PPPs, Motions To Dismiss and surveillance are all effective tools in defending questionable claims. While they cost time, money and resources, they are invaluable tools in aggressively defending a claim in the right case.

5/ Get Perspective

Consider how your actions on the claim affect other claims. Treating legitimate claimants well, and aggressively fighting questionable or fraudulent claims, is important not only on the present claim, but also for its ripple effect on other employees.

Car Accident On The Way To Doctor's Office Not Compensable

In *Gaytan v. Flanders Precisionaire*, 25 ILWCLB 190 (III. W.C. Comm. 2017), Petitioner was injured in a motor vehicle accident while on her way to a doctor's appointment for an earlier work-related injury. Respondent had its HR manager travel with Petitioner to the doctor's office to translate. While Petitioner was following her HR manager

to the doctor's office, Petitioner's vehicle was struck by a truck.

Petitioner filed a new workers' compensation claim arising from the motor vehicle accident but the arbitrator denied it as Petitioner's injuries did not arise out of and in the course of her employment.

On review, the Commission affirmed the arbitrator's decision and denied benefits. The Commission found it significant that Respondent did not exert control over Petitioner's physician choice and there was no obligation to attend the appointment. The Commission added that as Petitioner was not paid for her time to attend her medical appointments, it further exhibited an absence of control by Respondent.

Practice Tip:

Accidents occurring while attending medical appointments for a prior, work-related injury are typically not in the course of employment.

MMI Is Not Required To Terminate TTD

In *Holocker v. IWCC*, 2017 IL App (3rd) 160363WC, the Appellate Court affirmed the Commission's denial of TTD benefits although Petitioner was not at MMI.

Petitioner was operating a crane when he was struck in the face and chest by a loose strap.

Petitioner was released to full-duty work but could not operate a crane. Respondent accommodated Petitioner's restriction with work meeting his job description of "transportation operator".

Petitioner was subsequently terminated for unrelated reasons and terminated his TTD benefits despite still treating.

At arbitration, Petitioner sought TTD but Respondent offered evidence that there were jobs within Petitioner's restrictions.

The arbitrator found it important that Petitioner was not at MMI and awarded benefits.

The Appellate Court affirmed the Commission's TTD denial, holding that Petitioner's work-related injuries were stabilized and he was able to reenter the workforce.

The Appellate Court declined to interpret *Interstate Scaffolding* as requiring that a claimant's having reached MMI be the sole dispositive inquiry in determining entitlement to TTD benefits. The Appellate Court ruled that the test is whether the employee remains temporarily totally disabled as a result of a work-related injury **and** whether the employee is capable of returning to the work force. The Appellate Court confirmed that, under *Interstate Scaffolding*, Petitioner is not entitled to TTD when his work injuries no longer impact his ability to work or his employability.

Practice Tip:

Employers should be diligent in reviewing a claimant's work status on a case-by-case basis, as the possibility may exist to terminate TTD prior to reaching MMI under appropriate factual circumstances.
