Correlation is not Causation!

In Ameren Illinois v. Illinois Workers' Compensation Commission 2024 III. App. 5th 220606 (III. App. Ct. 2024) Petitioner worked as a gas journeyman repairing and replacing gas lines. He alleged that on 9/4/13 and 10/8/14, he was exposed to harmful chemicals which caused permanent damage to his lungs. He had a prior history of asthma with known flare-ups before the alleged exposure.

After the initial exposure, Petitioner claimed to have difficulty breathing, chest tightness and worsening asthma symptoms. Respondent obtained a Section 12 opinion from a pulmonologist who opined that Petitioner's respiration was unlabored as he was able to speak easily in complete sentences without stopping for breath. It was also noted that Petitioner's prior medical history of asthma flareups incurred no permanent partial disability as a result of his exposure. Petitioner's treating physician disagreed and opined that his asthmatic condition worsened as a result of the exposure and Petitioner sustained permanent damage to his lungs.

The arbitrator found that Petitioner failed to meet his burden of proof as to any indication of permanent aggravation or permanent partial disability in his underlying asthma. Therefore, Petitioner's claim for benefits was denied. The Illinois Workers' Compensation Commission affirmed. Petitioner appealed again and the Circuit Court reversed the Illinois Workers' Compensation Commission's Decision, finding it against the manifest weight of the evidence. Respondent appealed.

The Illinois Appellate Court reversed the Circuit Court and reinstated the Illinois Workers' Compensation Commission's Decision. Petitioner argued that under a chain of events theory, the Illinois Workers' Compensation Commission's Decision was against the manifest weight of the evidence and cited to Petitioner's worsening condition after the exposure. The Appellate Court disagreed and found the chain-of-events method of proving causation inapplicable because there was no previous condition of good pulmonary health. Instead, the evidence showed that Petitioner's pulmonary health had not been good for years as he suffered from shortness of breath, coughing and wheezing.

The Appellate Court held that a correlation between Petitioner's exposure and his worsening condition did not prove causation. The Court further held that the Commission's reliance on Respondent's expert was not supported by the evidence.

Practice Tip:

Petitioner must prove that their condition arose out of and in the course of employment. Evidence of pre-existing health issues may be used to argue that the condition is not work-related.

Accident not Proven by Chain of Events

In Ostrowski v. Ind. Univ., 237 N.E.3d 638 (Ind. Ct. App. 2024), the Appellate Court affirmed the Indiana Worker's Compensation Full Board Decision that Plaintiff did not qualify for worker's compensation benefits.

In June 2018, Plaintiff was diagnosed with atrial fibrillation and atypical atrial flutter. These issues were classified as permanent by Plaintiff's cardiologist. In July 2018, Plaintiff struggled to find a parking spot near the building where she worked and had to walk up a hill, after which she was out of breath, sweating and felt sick to her stomach. Plaintiff encountered a similar situation the next day. The following day, Plaintiff felt so ill she did not return to work and was instructed by her cardiologist to take eight weeks off due to her condition.

On 6/13/19, Plaintiff filed an Application for Adjustment of Claim. The single hearing member conducted a hearing where it was found that the alleged injuries were caused by "routine, everyday activities" and that the medical evidence supports Plaintiff's symptoms were temporary and could have occurred anywhere. On appeal, Plaintiff argued that her symptoms were not caused by everyday activities but that she was forced to walk an arduous trek to her office building. Plaintiff further argues that the board ignored the fact that she was found to be completely disabled by her cardiologist.

The Appellate Court held that the walk to and from Plaintiff's office was an everyday routine. They further held that there was sufficient evidence to support the board's conclusion that Plaintiff's injuries did not arise out of her employment but were instead temporary in nature based on personal risks caused by her pre-existing medical conditions.

Practice Tip:

Even when plaintiff is injured during the course of employment, there still must be a causal connection between the injury and the employment before it can be said the injury "arose out of." If plaintiff's injuries originate with a pre-existing condition, they are not compensable under the Act.
